Rest in pence

We went through a most trying time in the month of July as 3 of our beloved members, Dipendranath Bhattacharya, Ganesh Ghosal and Anjali Chatterjee left us after enduring much pain and suffering. Dipendranath and Ganesh came together to us from Vidya Sagar State General Hospital, and their departures from our world were within 20 days of one another.

Ganesh Ghosal belonged to the well-known Ghosal Family, which he left of his own will. Whatever his past may have been, he adjusted well with everybody in Charunibas; took up some responsibilities and provided good care for his roommates. His last couple of weeks was full of pain and suffering. After several days in Diamond Harbour Hospital, he was shifted to NRS Hospital where he passed away on 8th July.





Dipendranath Bhattacharya suffered from throat cancer. For his last few months, he lived in Bhalobasa to get easier access to periodic cancer treatment in hospitals. He suffered but showed great strength of will; he courageously endured the many chemotherapies and pain. Finally, he gave up on 23rd July.

Anjali Chatterjee, a calm and dignified lady whose young days were full of hurdles, had been living with us since 2019. She also suffered physically during her last days in Bhalobasa. and passed away on 31st July.





Welcome home

MARIAM **BENEDICT**: Mariam has now reached the age of 72, and was married at the age of 17. Her husband was a factory worker. Together they lived in a small rented house and had no children. Mariam was left alone after her husband's death, without any means to survive. Her supportive brother-inlaw died suddenly and Mariam became homeless. Ms. Delfina Boila, the retired teacher and Ex-President of FOKE, requested us to provide a permanent home for Mariam. Since 16th September, Mariam has been in Bhalobasa. She has various health issues which are being taken care of, while she is slowly settling in.

MUKUNDO DOLUI was a well known rickshaw puller at Chakraberia rickshaw stand. His father was a fruit seller and died an untimely death. Mukundo and his brother did not have the opportunity to attend school and the elder brother started rickshaw pulling for the family. Sadly, his mother and brother also died of illnesses and ill-health and at a tender age of 15, Mukundo was left living a lonely, working life of a rickshaw-puller. He rented a small house for himself, ate in roadside eateries and got a bit addicted to smoking and drinking. He is now almost 70, and due to a long life of hard work his body is frail. A sudden fall broke his femur bone and thereof he was unable to carry on with the rickshaw pulling. The house was soon gone due to non-payment of rent and he ended up living on the streets near Ramrajatala bazaar in a helpless condition.



He was watched for few days by two Good Samaritans – Santana Banerjee and Subhasmita Das, who after befriending him decided to rescue him. They admitted him to Howrah Hospital where he was operated. After discharge he was temporarily kept in a night shelter. FOKE remained in connection and upon completion of the legal procedures he came to live in Charunibas on 16th August. He is an active member and takes responsibility for his new big family. Everyone loves him for his kind and soft nature.

Repatriation Of Jubeda Khatun



Jubeda Khatun was initially rescued by HIVE INDIA with the help of Lake Police Station. Jubeda came to live in Bhalobasa from 9th September 2021. Sadly, she came to us with massive mental trauma. It was difficult to keep her indoors as she always wanted to walk out and find her way home. Jubeda's plight convinced us to continue our search for her family. With continuous care and unconditioned love we were able to gather bits and pieces of information about her home and relatives in Assam (a state in North East India). Our psychologists Nirmal Sarkar and Sohini Sarkar took the responsibility of gathering every bit of information she could give, based upon which FOKE approached HAM RADIO and, amazingly, HAM Radio was able to connect with her relatives on a video call within a day of receiving the information. However, the son did not want to co-operate and the process continued being delayed. We tried to look for local NGOs and old age homes around her hometown as an alternative. However, after overcoming several challenges, Jubeda's brother and her nephews agreed to take her home with them. With the intervention of Rupai police station in Assam, HIVE India and with everybody's consolidated efforts, her nephews reached Kolkata late night on 6th July 2023 and we arranged a hotel for them to stay overnight. We are thankful to Lake Police Station for helping with all the official procedures.

Jubeda was ready to go back home, but was also sad to leave behind the friends she had made in Bhalobasa and Charunibas. It was a happy and emotional moment for all of us.

We stay in touch with Jubeda and her family. We thank Ambarish Nag Biswas of HAM Radio, for making the first connection which later helped us move forward. Special thanks to Nirmal Sarkar for keeping at it and giving Jubeda the opportunity to spend the rest of her life with her loved ones.

Our Outreach Activities

Happy Classroom

As on 31st December, we had 60 students in Bhalobasa and 56 in Charunibas. One of our students, Manisha Mondal, will be appearing for her Class X exam in February 2024.

The second half of the year was full of academic activities like regular classes, remedial classes, online classes, extra –curricular activities and parents teachers meetings and in preparing students for their final school exams.





Celebrations:

Our children celebrated birthdays of great personalities, members of our homes, teachers and students. By doing this, we hope to encourage values like sensitivity, empathy, integrity and accountability in our children as they are growing up.

This year our theme for Independence Day was "environment protection", so our children cleaned their surroundings and villages, planted saplings, participated in processions with posters made by them, and other cultural activities.

Other celebrations like Buddha Purnima, Durga Puja, Eid, Rakhi Bondhon, Christmas and New Year have become an integral part of Happy Classroom.





Special Invitation:

In celebration of Rangamala Memorial`s 20th Anniversary on 23rd November, our three nursing students Rubina, Rakhi & Simran presented an outstanding dance performance. They were given a stipend of Rs. 2000 each for their nursing training course. Overcoming many adversities in their lives, these students are making their paths towards a better future with support and encouragement from us.



Update on the Nursing Training of our students:

Our three students Rubina, Rakhi and Simran completed their theory classes on nursing and will start their practical classes by way of placement in different hospitals/ nursing homes. Sadly, Rubina is not continuing the practical session, but we hope she will resume her training in the next session.

Update on the computer classes in Bhalobasa Happy Classroom.

30 students from classes V to X are enrolled for computer classes on weekends. The Students have learnt MS DOS, HTML, Flowchart and MS Excel and have appeared for an exam as well.



Our teachers visit the families of our students every two weeks. It is especially important to visit the parents who are not regularly attending the Parents Teachers Meetings. From January 2024, we are rescheduling our classes in Charunibas: will we now conduct a morning session from 7-10 am for students of Classes Nursery to IV to give the children some time to play in the afternoons. This will also reduce the burden on our teachers and improve the quality of education with fewer students in the afternoon session.



Educational tour:

On 15th December, our students went for a "City Visit" to Kolkata where they visited Victoria Memorial, Birla Planetarium, Nehru Children's Museum and St. Paul's Cathedral. None of our students have had the opportunity to see these places before, so it was truly a lifetime experience for everybody. We thank all who donated and supported us to make this event successful.

Awareness programme:

We made a presentation on "social media" to create awareness about possible risks, and thereby hoping to promote safe social media use for our children. This session was conducted by Bidisha Ghosal- our volunteer.

Teachers Training:

An educational workshop was held at our Thakurpukur unit on the 28th of December. It was conducted by Ms. Piyali Sen and was attended by the Happy Classroom teachers of both units. The workshop was aimed at providing proper and basic guidelines for class management at the primary level, and covered different areas of importance like discipline, evaluations, lesson planning, attending to specific needs of the children, and much more. The workshop also included demo classes of the different school subjects, interactive discussions and various suggestions.



Exposure Programme



Nurses Exposure programme:

On 4th July 2023, 5 nurses doing their final year of Nursing Training from Nilratan Sarkar Medical College Hospital, attended a full-day exposure programme in Bhalobasa where they learnt about geriatric care and the administration of an old age home. This kind of exposure programme is now regular in our homes and it is now a compulsory part of nursing training in Government Medical College.

Vocational Training



In-house Training on Tailoring in Charunibas:

We resumed the training on tailoring, in Charunibas as all the construction/ rebuilding work is now over. 20 participants started on 5th August, and will appear for their internal exams in January. This will be followed by an external exam held in another vocational training unit. Each trainee will receive a valid certificate from the Institute.

To empower the women around Bhalobasa, in Thakurpukur area, we collaborate with Transcendent Knowledge Society and the programme "Charka". Several mothers of the students of Happy Classroom attend the training on tailoring, block printing, embroidery, and natural dye. It has been observed there is a change in adaptation of the skills among the women with eagerness to learn new skills. Though there has been several drop outs from amongst the batch of 35, due to various reasons, the overall response is positive. Charka's future plan will be absorbing them in their production unit; connect them with market and designers for order and to establish home enterprise

Outreach programme with our networking partner: Kaikala Chetona

SUPPORT TO RURAL ELDERLY (Sabar Community)

The support program for the distressed elderly persons at and around Kaikala village under Haripal block of Hooghly district continues to benefit the identified elderly persons who cannot work, lives alone or with families but are unable sustain themselves due to poverty.



During this term 45 aged from 6 different locations benefited from the dry food provided periodical and new clothes, winter clothes and blankets during the festive season and winter. They received additional food support during Durga Puja and Christmas. To some we provide prescribed medicines.





Well wisher Shri Ashis Kumar Dey visited Kanakpur village on 30th December with his family and spent time with the identified elderly persons of the 'Sabar' tribal community and distributed 60 blankets and other clothes, varieties of fruits and cakes. Children and other community members also received the gifts. This was facilitated by FOKE and organized by Kaikala Chetona with their excellent management skill.



Education Programme: FOKE supported the education project till July, 2023. The initial target group was the 'Sabar' tribal community and now the project has expanded to include the 'Santhali' tribal community as well. At present, there are 8 'Sabar' Centers and 4 'Santhali' Centers which benefit more than 500 children. Along with quality education, we try to provide nutritional tiffin which partially compensate for their nutritional deficiency and encourage them in attending the centres and learning. If fund permit we will continue to support the education programme in future.

Special thanks to **Somnath Chatterjee and all the team members** of Kailkala Chetona for dedicated input, interest and love in their ways of delivering the much needed services, and also in helping FOKE spread in the rural areas of West Bengal.

Sharing resources: Every year before Durga Puja, we get saris, night dresses, petticoats and blouses from the **Kolkata Municipal Corporation**. We happily shared these precious gifts with a night shelter called Ghare Phera, Tahader Katha and Kailkala Chetana. We also supported NGOs namely Baranagar Petals and Oikyatan Paribar by sharing the donated blankets for distribution amongst the families of brick-kiln workers in Madhyamgram and tribal communities in Purulia. Recycled clothes were shared with Kaikala Chetana. Thank you **Mr. Pradip Arora** and **Mr. Rajesh Khanna** for your donation of blankets for the poorest of the poor.
