OBITUARY



The first Patron of Friends of Kolkata's Elderly.

Sr. Cyril Josephine Mooney, born in Ireland on 21 July 1936, came to India at the age of 20. She was the Principal of Loreto Day School Sealdah from 1979 till 2012. During her leadership, she empowered all her students and staff members to strive and keep an open eye beyond the walls of their regular comfort zones. The deeply

ingrained inequalities in our society made her uncomfortable, and thus she crossed the boundaries of fear, subjugation and limitations to follow her conscience. 'Compassion is a compulsory subject', she used to say. Sr. Cyril therefore made the school into an inclusive atmosphere where human beings with values were continuously developed through her practical social development programmes. The human and infrastructural resources were used to its utmost limits, thus making us a part of the mission of 'equal opportunities for all'. Her astuteness and inner eye to see the potential of her students and staff was a unique power in itself.

I thank Sr. Cyril for giving me all the opportunities in life to know what I was capable of. FOKE in its journey over the last 20 years is only trying in its most humble ways to break the barriers of inequality and injustice. With Sr. Cyril's guidance and blessing the journey began when she



allowed the Rainbow children (street children living in the school) to go out with daily lunch packets to feed the elderly living on the platforms of Sealdah Railway Station, and her faith remained with us. She always believed that as long as the work for the poor is done with love and sincerity, then surely money, resources and support will follow. FOKE is a testimony to this belief as our 20 years truly is a miraculous journey made possible by the generosity of many. Thank you Sr. Cyril for making us a channel of your Peace and Love. Keep guiding and never let the attitude of "Damn it, Do It", ever die in us!

BHALCBASHA

Non - Resident support:

Basanti Dhara comes on a non-residential basis since 8 April 2023. She stays the entire day in Bhalobasa and has her meals with us. Presently, she is living in a small rented house which she has to vacate in June 2023. We will take her as a resident from July 2023 as she is unable to pay the rent any more. By then we will also have space in Charunibas as Zubeda will soon return to her home in Assam. Basanti is calm, considerate and willingly helps the other ailing members.

Non resident medical support:

Sahadeb Some rescued a dying lady – Samila Bibi, from the railway platforms after receiving a message from **Baranarag Petals**. She was admitted in Dr. Fuad Halim's nursing home while the search for her family members continued. **Baranagar Petals** played a vital role in the process to find her family. We shared the medical costs and the cremation was carried out by her family members.



Therapy Sessions

In both homes two of our teachers, namely Aparna Mukherjee in Charunibas and Soma Banerjee in Bhalobasa is assigned to involve our members in activities. Children are also encouraged to participate. Psychologists, Nirmal Sarkar and Sohini Sarkar visit both homes and involve all our members in outdoor / indoor activities. Our staff members carry out these activities on a regular basis to keep them active. Exercises, yoga, music therapy, dance, drawing, different indoor games and engaging in different household chores is all part of the therapy. As our members come malnourished with severe mental trauma and acute ill-heath, they need special care, love and motivation.

Volunteers are encouraged to join in these daily therapy sessions as they carry great value for the welfare of our members.



Administrative Updates:

The official inauguration of the registered office of FOKE, which is now in Bhalobasa, was on 14 January when we had our AGM. All official documents with our office setup have been established now in Bhalobasa.



The final phase of work with the grant received from Concentrix Daksh Private Limited for the construction / repair of Charunibash ended in June 2023. The grant utilization report and final report was submitted to both PC Chandra Jewellers Private Limited and Concentrix Daksh Private Limited during this phase.

Medical news

During this term there was major treatment for Dipendranath who has throat cancer and is being treated in PG hospital and going through chemotherapy in Bangur Hospital. His health is deteriorating very fast. Uma goes to Diamond Harbour hospital for psychiatric follow up and dental checkup. Khudiram was admitted in Hope hospital for respiratory problems. Ganesh Ghosal was taken to Diamond Harbour hospital to the dermatology department. Maya was taken to medicine department for follow-up treatment of asthma, while Shital was examined in the ENT department. Satyabrata had some neurological problems for which he was admitted in Mohon's Nursing home. Annapurna underwent her vitrectomy operation in Vivekananda Netra Niramoy. Dr. Provamoy Mahato visited Bhalobasa in April and June 2023. Dr. Sathi Sarkar from Vidyasagar Hospital checked all our members in Charunibas.

Celebrations and festivals

Birthdays of great men like Swami Vivekananda, Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose and Rabindra Nath Tagore was celebrated.

Republic Day, Saraswati puja, Buddha Purnima, Good Friday, Easter, Holi, Eid were celebrated with zeal. Celebration of birthdays of our resident members, staff and students is also a common practice.

In the last couple of years nearly 50 former students volunteered in Happy Classroom; I am amazed to receive many requests for volunteering in our education centres, from my ex- students. They volunteer in different capacities- some do regular teaching, some teach occasionally while some visit to interact at different level. The most inspiring fact is that they visit with their children and interact with the students and the senior members. Those who are settled abroad try to help in resource building.

My subject was Social Science, where I taught them about societal structure, social responsibilities and did various related project. I am happy today that they have grown up to be responsible citizens. - **Piyali Sen**

Online Classes: The Sai Baba Seva Ashram & Yoga is now providing online classes for our students of Classes V to VII on weekends, in Charunibas. The children learn Basic English and general knowledge. They have donated a smart television and we now have Wi-Fi connection for the classes.





This year we had a joint Annual Sports Day in Madhubati, on 29.1.23, with students of both Happy Classrooms. This meant the students of Bhalobasa had a great outing this time. The primary school students of Bhalobasa enjoyed their Annual sports with the elderly members in Bhalobasa itself on 4.2.23.

International Mother Language Day was celebrated and organised by Rangamala Memorial Development Initiative in Charunibas where there was a sit-and-draw competition, elocution and extempore. Several students from the local government schools also participated.

6 student from Bhalobasa Happy Classroom recited poems at Bioygarh Boy's High School in presence of eminent personalities. Keya Basu traines and encourages them to participate outside their known environment.

Summer Camp







At Happy Classoom our Summer Camp from 17.5.23 till 01.6.23 continued with full enthusiasm.

Topics covered in Bhalobasa Happy Classroom were Evolution, the Democratic system- rights and responsibilities, concept of money - money and credit, gender equality, , Rules of Bengali spellings and first aid. These were conducted by different resource persons organised by Mrs. Sen, who are mostly her former students.

Activities with the elderly residents was also part of the camp.

In Charunibas a full day session with sports, waste management, travel and child marriage was conducted by Mr. Nirmal Sarkar and Mrs. Sohini Sarkar.

Resource persons from **Kaikala Chetana** did workshops on practical science, origami, easy maths, which was much enjoyed by the students of Charunibas Happy Classroom.

Session of First Aid was conducted by **Champa Majumder**- our Medical co-ordinator.



Our Outreach Activities

Nursing Training: Three of our students namely, Rubina Khatoon, Rakhi Barang and Simran Parveen, after passing their class X board exam has joined nursing training since 19 April 2023, for 1 year. Presently, they are attending the theory classes thrice a week This course is being provided by St. John's Ambulance in collaboration with Rotary Club.



Session on Empowerment:

On 8.6.23 we had a session conducted by Alka Karnani from Bandhan Bank on savings. A film show was followed by interaction as to why women should save. They were encouraged to save 1 rupee per day.





Transcendent Knowledge Society has a programme named CHARKA. A meeting was held with the interested women from the community on the same day. They offered professional training in tailoring and block printing.

20 ladies are presently receiving professional training which will soon make them capable of earning decent wages. We are happy to provide this opportunity and empower the women around Bhalobasa.

Upcoming Training on Tailoring in Charunibas: For the tailoring classes three meetings with the women of the communities were held. Teacher Suprabha Bera was introduced and the training for the group of 20 ladies will start from 5 August 2023.



SABAR' CHILDREN'S EDUCATION PROGRAM: The partnership for this program started from January 2023. More than 500 'Sabar' children receive supplementary stimulating education, through 8 centers, within a 15 km radius area, based at Kaikala village. In addition to providing education, special programs, such as, health check-ups, environmental programs and special feeding of the children are also organised. FOKE could only sponsor these education centres for seven months (January till July 2023), as funding to continue the same is not available at present. If funds permit, we will surely sponsor the education centres, knowing how fruitful it is for the children's development and future possibilities.

Annual Eye Check-up Camp



Like every year, GKB Optical carried out their CSR activity by way of conducting a free eye camp in Charunibas for the villagers. Following the eye check-up by GKB optical on 31st January 2022, where 230 villagers were checked, the distribution of free spectacles for 169 villagers was conducted on 5 April 2022. We had another free camp on 23 February 2023, where 203 villagers were checked and 174, including our members & staff, received free spectacles of very good quality. We are thankful to the associates of GKB for continuing their services.

Our Special guests

It was our great pleasure to invite all the elderly members of Notun Ghar run by Kestopur Jagorani Foundation on 11 February 2023. These elderly members were once homeless and 'Notun Ghar' is now their permanent home. They came with many gifts and learning materials for Happy Classroom and the day was spent with much fun, laughter, dance, music and food.



Outreach programme with our networking partner: Kaikala Chetana

programme: Sabar community food Presently we have 42 elderly members belong to this very community. They receive monthly rations along with occasional medical support clothes. Kailkala Chetana takes responsibility for the distribution and their general wellbeing, while costs from supports the the donations received. One main feature of this program is its flexibility which allows the local organizers to make the final decisions on the selection of beneficiaries and the type of support mostly needed.





Brickfield school project:

We have set up an education centre at the BMBS brick-kiln for children of the Hindi-speaking migrant labourers. Since 6 January 2023, the centre started with 44 enrolled children and two experienced female teachers. The Center seemed attractive to the children and their parents, so quickly the number of enrolled children increased to 67. The project is extremely important given that these children are otherwise denied any access to education during the period

the families stay and work in the brick-kiln. The Center works for 4 days a week from Tuesday to Friday, for roughly 2-3 hours a day and the children mainly learn through play and activities. They learn academics as well as extra-curricular activities.

Along with education, we provide some nutritional food to the children on each working day. We started with a cost of Rs.3/- per child which within a few days increased to Rs. 10/- per child as our friends and well-wishers came forward to support the cause. It means that the children, who are in need of nutritional support, receive the same while they are with us.

A medical camp was organised in the brick-kiln on 23 January 2023. On this day the committee members of FOKE visited to spend the day with everyone there.

Well-wishers of FOKE like Mrs. Mahesweta Chakraborty provided slippers to the children and for many it was their first experience of footwear. Ms. Rajni Dhanuka and Shri Dibyendu Baidya sponsored sumptuous food to the children in celebration of their special days.

We all know the importance of teaching our children values and to learn by examples to show true compassion to those who need it. I am so fortunate that my children have learnt all these and over the years did their part for the children and members of FOKE. On Easter Monday wearing a jumper with the FOKE emblem Ella walked 2 kms to raise money for FOKE. It is such an amazing achievement for a little girl, but more importantly the lesson to be learnt here is to encourage our young children to be proactive and do their bit for those in need. I am the proudest grandmother that my children and my first grandchild are part of the FOKE family. Welcome Ella, our youngest volunteer ever, and I hope this inspires other volunteers both abroad and in India, to have empathy and compassion to do what is right and just, for others less fortunate, by including our youth.

With the money Ella raised we got beads and wool for the members to engage themselves. There was also toiletries, mosquito nets, cotton towels for all.
