She often said that this was an activity she looked forward to. Arundhati opened the door of her home to Parvati, a young vulnerable woman on the street. Not only did she give a secure home to Parvati, but allowed Calcutta Rescue's staff and physiotherapists to visit her home for Parvati's treatment and therapy. From time to time, in spite of her very busy schedule as a trainer and supervisor in the Industrial Training Institute, Arundhati drove Parvati to the Calcutta Rescue clinic for her check ups and medications. Asif, a staff member of Calcutta Rescue, shared that 'this was a rare selfless act'. Our members and staff will miss her visits in the homes and we will miss her presence our meetings. Rest in Peace. Welcome Home



Balli's Homecoming is quite special: 18th of March 2024 was an extraordinary day at FOKE as we witnessed an unprecedented incident at Bhalobasa involving two ladies - one choosing to leave and one choosing to move in. Subhra Sarkar was rescued not far from Bhalobasa, but after a couple of weeks, she was unwilling to stay on and decided to return to her so-called nephew and was ready to get back to a life of uncertainties. Coincidentally, on the same day we spotted a lady in an alley very near our home and when we approached her, she readily agreed to come home with us. It was the easiest rescue we ever did. After a good shower and lunch in Bhalobasa, we took Balli, Subhra and the nephew to Thakurpukur police station to lodge the General Diaries for both.

We had mixed feelings of letting one go and welcoming another - but we managed both situations simultaneously. We had no vacant bed, but Subhra's decision to leave gave Balli the opportunity to stay on in Bhalobasa. (Read the story by Auden and Petra in this newsletter)







Most members are under constant medical care. Satyabrata, Sandhya, Uma, Salma Arun and Sova were all taken to Diamond Harbour Hospital for check-ups and treatment. Lovely. Khudiram and Kalpana were admitted to Hope Kolkata Foundation Hospital. Shefali, Mukundo and Sital were taken for treatment in Dr. Arnab's Hati's Nursing home. In Bhalobasa, Jyotsna is being treated by Dr. Swati Sarkar. Dr. S. Brahma is consulted on a regular basis for specific patients for changing of doses for their psychiatric medicines. Dr. Pravamoy Mahato visited Bhalobasa on 26.05.24 and on 21.06.24 for general check-ups of the members. He is a kindhearted person and is available over the phone whenever needed.

Non - residential programme : Since May 2023 we have started to provide dry food and prescribed medicines to the following :

Rasamay Naskar is unmarried and 60 years old. He lives with his elder brother's family. He suffers from various diseases and though both his nephews care for him, it is difficult to procure medicine and pathological tests from their restricted income.





Shanti Mondal is aged about 69. She and her husband are both sick. Their 3 daughters are married but cannot afford the regular medicines for their parents, though they all contribute towards the daily living costs. Since April 2024, FOKE has been providing their monthly medicines.

Lakshmi Das is about 60 years old. She has a married son and a daughter. Though her son doesn't take any responsibility, Laxmi's daughter tries to help from her own meagre income. Sometimes when health permits, Laxmi does little jobs in Kolkata. Her main requirements are some dry food with grocery items which we are happily supporting.



Reba Nandi is a resident of Madhyamgram. After a brain stroke she became bedridden. Her son Sukhendu found us on a social website and requested medical support for his mother. We responded and are paying the monthly physiotherapy bills since April 2024. We will continue for as long as the support is needed. Baranagar Petal is looking after their dry food

other medical expenses and collaborative effort will surely help Reba to gain

the ability to be mobile again.

Joseph Sarkar and Nilima Sarkar, a couple aged about 65 and 60 years, have two married sons and one daughter living separately. Joseph used to work in a private company. With the sudden closure of the company, he started to earn money as a rickshaw puller. Sadly, he had a serious backbone injury seven vears ago. Therefore, he is unable to walk much and has to rest a lot. The sometimes vounger son provides financial support when he has some extra money from working overtime. Some dry food and grocery items are being provided to ease their daily living.



Manju Das has been receiving monthly monetary support 500) and prescribed medicines as well as pathology tests for several years now.



Rescue and Rehabilitation:

Montu Roy was provided medical support in Dr. Fuad Halim's Nursing Home after being rescued by Sahadeb Some.

Though Montu has a son and wife, he is abandoned for reasons not clear. We responded to his immediate medical need when he was nearly dying; he is now settled in Apna Ghar Ashram.

Sabar Community Food & Medical programme

We continuing the dry programme for the Sabar community in with collaboration Kaikala Chetana... Presently there are 29 recipient of monthly rations and some are receiving prescribed medicines Since April 2024 we are paying the vendors directly for all purchase. medicines. Mr. Dibendyu Baidya – a friend of FOKE visited and sponsored food for 50 children at a Sabar Community centre. Thank you Mr. Baidya.

In February 2024 from FOKE we visited and met most of them in their own habitat. Further plans on their medical need was discussed.

Nursing training: After their class X board exams, our two students Simran Parveen and Suparna Batang completed the GDA theory training and received their certificates. After the completion of their theory classes, their 6-week practical training was completed in Hope Kolkata Foundation Hospital. They received not only the best training, but also the support of all the staff members. To ease their financial burden, we paid their daily travel costs to Hope hospital during their practical training. We appreciate the opportunity provided by the Management of Hope Kolkata Foundation Hospital.





Computer Training: Prita Roy is a college student and a maths teacher in Bhalobasa HC. She helps with computer teaching and administrative work as well. To empower her and develop her abilities, we have sponsored her computer course on advanced excel training for 6 months.

Educational Sponsorship: Monisha Mondal passed her Class X exam this year and we are happy to sponsor her admission and study materials for class XI. Monisha has the eagerness to learn and is a great dancer. She helps the weaker students as well as teaches dance in Bhalobasa HC. We are glad to pay her a token amount.







Training on Tailoring: The last group of 24 students completed their training in February 2024. Unfortunately, there were 10 dropouts for various family and personal reasons. On May 11th 2024, another batch of 21 students started and will continue for 6 months. The syllabus consists of making 2 kinds of petticoats, 2 kinds of salwar pants, churidar, blouse, palazzo, ankle pants, night dresses, umbrella cut gown and punjabi suit. Suprabha Bera is a dedicated trainer with a very pleasant personality. She lovingly involves herself with the elderly residents.

Staff appreciation: This time the Annual Staff Appreciation day was organised at Rishika Garden with hearty support from Raja Das (who did all building works in Bhalobasa in the last 3 years). The speciality of this year's picnic was the enthusiasm of many voung teachers the Classroom. We had dance and songs with a special music system on hire. We also had some lovely recitations. Making reels was the highlight along with team building games and other games. This year the best staff award was offered to Aradhana Singh. She **Charunibas** has looked after excellently for a number of years now, and continues to do so through thick and thin..



Experience shared:

Auden Nedrelid and Petra Lapvetelainen, a Norwegian/Finnish couple, are both freelancers within media. They have done films and photography for many NGOs in Asia. They were glad to share their experiences in FOKE:

OUR TWO DAYS WITH FOKE It is March 2024 and we are in Kolkata as part of a work trip to Asia this winter. We travel as a media team to document projects for different aid organisations. FOKE is a project that we have followed for a long time, and when we met Sanghita it was natural to ask if we could come and document FOKE's important work at Charunibas and Bhalobasa as volunteers.

CHARUNIBAS: We drove out of Kolkata into the countryside and onto narrow roads to the red house, which is beautifully located next to a small lake. Everyone who has visited FOKE knows that it is like entering someone's home, where both those who live there and those who come to visit know that it is a safe and good place. The residents sit in the shade on the veranda and welcome us with their big smiles. We have a cup of tea and a nice talk before we go up to the second floor.

We hear the familiar sound of school children reading. The second floor is divided into three small classrooms where children from different grade levels are taught by teachers volunteering at Charunibas. They provide teaching and help with studies and homework to the children who live in the villages around.

On the first floor, singing and a health check-up is planned before lunch. Once a week, the nurse Champa comes to take the blood pressure and does other health checks on everyone who lives there; she is there to see if there is anyone who needs medical attention.

A little later, the whole house is filled with songs. A volunteer, Monimala Bhattacharya has come and will sponsor lunch today, and she sings songs with the residents before lunch. We hear famous Indian songs from Bollywood and other traditional songs. She is happy to be able to contribute to creating joy among the residents.

On the second floor, the sound of children studying has been replaced by the sound of sewing machines and women talking. FOKE organises sewing training for the women of the village and they gather once a week to sew and make different garments. They showed us the beautiful, colourful garments they have made.

With the evening approaching everybody was getting ready for a double birthday celebration. It's Piu's birthday, who is one of the teachers and Mukundo, one of the resident of Charunibas. A cake is placed on the table in the middle of the yard and they each get to blow out their candles. Everyone claps and sings the birthday song and each gets a gift. For Mukundo this is a special day, because it is the first time in his life that his birthday is being celebrated. We join the others in the celebration, eating cake and chatting. The atmosphere is joyful and it's wonderful to see how everyone, from the young school children to the elderly residents, are enjoying spending time together. We see why the work that FOKE does is so important.





BHALOBASA: A few days later we get to visit Bhalobasa. Today Jhinku Banerjee, who is a photographer and treasurer of FOKE and a friend of Sanghita, was introduced to us. She has followed FOKE over several years and we share experiences around both photography and this project. We visited CHARKA workshop who provides training on sewing and block printing for the women referred by FOKE. On the way back, we saw an elderly woman lying on the street sleeping in the scorching sun. Flies were buzzing around her and we realised that this is not a normal sleep. Sanghita walked over, woke her up, asked her name and offered her to come for food and a shower at Bhalobasa. She was disoriented but gets up and on unstable legs walks with us to the house and said her name is Balli. She gets a shower, clean clothes and her lunch. After lunch, Balli sits on the bench, smoking a bidi and smiling happily with her one tooth. We were still wondering if she wants to stay or walk away.

Beside Balli on the bench, Subhra sits with her nephew. She came into the home a couple of weeks ago after living and begging on the streets for several years. Subhra was missing her nephew and despite the hard life on the street, she decided to return to her street life. This is a choice that we must respect, says Sanghita.

The home is actually full, but now that Subhra decided to leave, there will be a bed free for Balli. In order to be formally registered they must go to the local police station to report that Subhra is moving out and Balli has been rescued and will be moving in. An auto arrives and both women join Sanghita and Jhinku to the police station to lodge the general diaries.

In the afternoon, the house is filled with children from the local community who receive extra lessons and activities together with the residents. A couple of psychologists, Nirmal and Sohini Sarkar, were doing physical training and art therapy with both the elderly and the children. We watched Balli smile as a little girl was holding her hand; she will adjust to life at Bhalobasa very well, we think. The subject for the art therapy class was the Holi festival, which will be celebrated soon.

Before we left, we interviewed Sanghita and Dipti sang for us; she has a beautiful voice and a strong story as to how she got to Bhalobasa. We could sit there and listen to all the stories from the elderly and the sounds from the youths who are still there doing different activities, but we had to say goodbye as it was getting late. It has been two days full of experiences, and we are happy that we can be involved in this important work with FOKE. Both our hearts and hard drives were full of good memories that will be used in films and documentations in the future.
